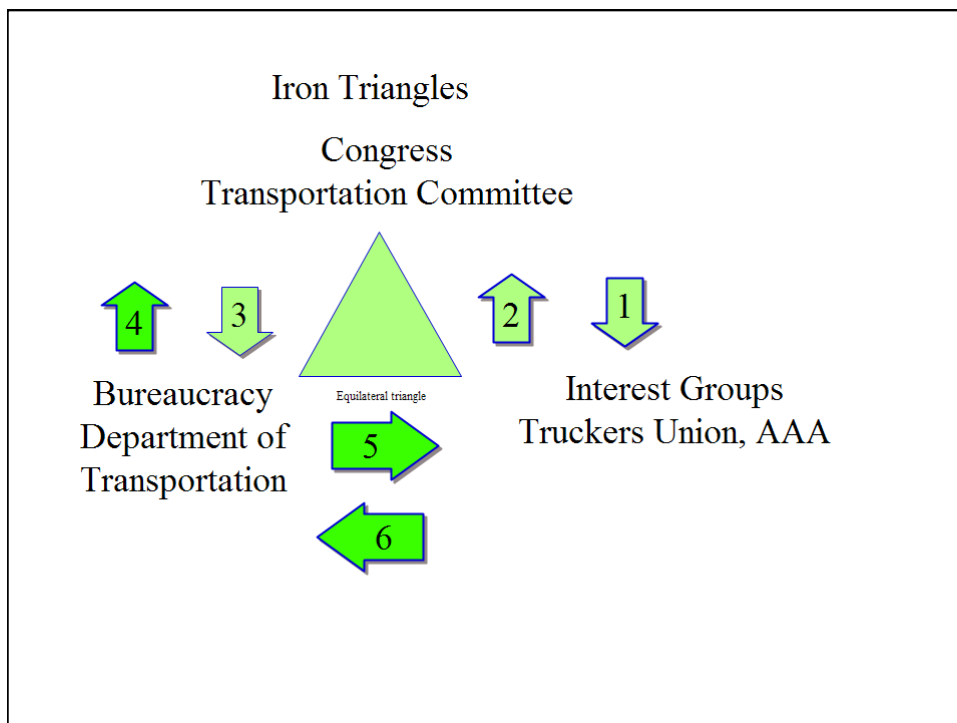

Arrow One

Arrow Two

- **1. Give members of Congress information
about the group.**
- **2. Give members electoral support.**
- **3. Give members campaign contributions**

Arrow Three

- **1. Committees could give budgetary support or jurisdictional growth.**
- **2. Keep the bureaucracy informed.**
- **3. Give the bureaucracy access to legislative process and call them as witnesses to hearings.**
- **4. Give the agencies positive legislation**

Arrow Four

- **1. Bureaucracy could give positive legislative enforcement.**
- **2. Give the committees information, research, and technical information needed for legislative changes.**

Arrow Five

1. Bureaucracy could give positive legislative enforcement.
2. Give information when agency is making regulatory changes.
3. Give the interest groups research information or share information.
4. Give access when planning on making policy change

Arrow Six

- **1. Interest groups can give information about the groups.**
- **2. Give the bureaucracy information about policy implications or other information.**
- **3. Give enforcement support.**
- **4. Give budgetary support when agencies' budgets are being discussed.**
